The International Peace Garden has served as a unique memorial to the peace that has existed between the United States of America and Canada since 1932. The Peace Garden began as a dream of Dr. Henry J. Moore of Islington, Ontario, Canada when he was returning home from the 1928 annual meeting of the National Association of Gardeners, a U.S. organization.

The International Peace Garden was dedicated on July 14, 1932. A crowd



estimated as high as 70,000 people from Canada and the US were in attendance.

Nature's peaceful traditions arouse a profound feeling of friendship. The gardens demonstrate this friendship with their beautiful colors and unique location. The peaceful friendship of the Canadian and United States Border is demonstrated with the North Dakota - Manitoba Envirothon. Peoples from both sides of the border have devised and created the event you are today attending. May our nations never break this tie of friendship they have developed with the natural beauty of the International Peace Gardens.
