





Garden began as a dream of
Dr. Henry J. Moore of
Islington, Ontario, Canada
when he was returning home
from the 1928 annual meet ing of the National
Association of Gardeners, a
U.S. organization.

The International Peace Garden was dedicated on July 14, 1932. A crowd





estimated as high as 70,000 people from Canada and the US were in attendance.
